

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THE FOOD REVOLUTION: IS AFRICA THE NEXT BREADBASKET OF THE WORLD?

Africa is home to one of the world's fastest growing young population, projected to reach 2.5 billion by 2050. In the context of diminishing natural resources and effects of climate change, Africa must produce enough food to feed herself, and perhaps develop enough to export to other parts of the world. Africa still presents a very fertile landscape and is very receptive to a variety of crops and livestock peculiarly adapted to her climate.

Scope:

We invite speakers to open up this topic in the direction of agricultural opportunities in Africa, from mechanised farming to livestock and poultry, demonstrating new opportunities and methods within the agricultural sector, attractive enough to invite investments from UK residents.

THE CHARITY FACTOR: MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN AFRICA

Scope

We invite speakers from governmental and non-governmental bodies, or entrepreneurs involved in healthcare delivery on the continent. The discussion should provide information, insight and facts to help define an investment possibility.

BRIDGING THE COMMUNICATION GAP: TECHNOLOGY, COMMUNICATIONS & JOINED-UP TRADE

Africa is famously impacted by a lack of infrastructure, and where legacy infrastructure has failed, technology has moved in. Nowhere is this more marked than it is in the field of communications. Communications technology has transformed the way Africa responds to the world, and has changed Africa. From Fintech to education to health, technology continues to drive change in Africa. Communications also enables connections and visibility of new markets and new methods.

Scope:

We invite speakers who are technology entrepreneurs or practitioners, able to discuss opportunities made possible by technology. Areas of interest are implementation, application, education, health, telecoms/radio, content development and marketing.



RENEWABLE ENERGY & SUSTAINABLE ENVIRONMENT

Renewable energy is one of the top 10 most lucrative opportunities in Africa. This area continues to develop, grow and change in other countries, presenting opportunities for change in Africa as well.

Scope:

We invite speakers to discuss the impact of renewable energy on manufacturing, agriculture and other aspects of commercial activity in Africa. The speaker will promote opportunities for development and delivery of renewable energy in Africa, identifying changes in the environment, and new technologies within the market.

PHARMACEUTICAL SECTOR CRUCIAL TO AFRICA'S GROWTH

According to a report by the Economic Commission for Africa, 70% of medicines used in Africa are imported. With the rising population and need to respond quickly and cost-effectively to ailments, there is an urgent need to meet Africa's pharmaceutical needs locally and speedily. Spending on pharmaceuticals in Africa is projected to reach \$45bn by 2020, a rise of over \$20bn on spend in 2012.

Scope:

We invite speakers to discuss identified opportunities for local development of drugs in Africa; identify schemes that can help, including government schemes.
